Not to be left out, the Hilton Hua Hin Resort and Spa (•www3.hilton.com) has stylishly appointed rooms with balconies overlooking the sea, and a staggering choice of 10 restaurants and bars from which to imbibe the surroundings. For something different, the Sansiri Hotel Collection's Escape Hua Hin (•www. escape-hotel.com) has re-created the look of traditional Hua Hin fishing villages, with red-roofed villas set around a beautiful pool, with Sand, Sun, and Sea rooms to choose from, each incorporating different scents, colors, and music. Surrounded by lush greenery, the Dusit Thani Hua Hin (•www.dusit.com) resembles a Mediterranean villa retreat with Thai touches, and the large pool is flanked by an ornamental lake and lily pond; outstanding service and amenities complement the elegant surroundings. If you are looking for colonial and historic charm, the Centara Grand Beach Resort and Villas (•www.centarahotelsresorts.com)

bit of Morocco in Thailand, with exotic riad-style mansions with courtyards and pools, plus the award-winning Casablanca Restaurant and Shisha Bar to add to your North African fantasies.
